

## 1951 Federal Fire Truck

Bids will be accepted for this vehicle until July 18th, 2018. Send bids to Mark Dill, Hutchinson County Auditor, P O Box 850, Stinnett, Texas 79083. Bid will be awarded July 23rd, 2018.

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This truck was purchased by the City of Borger in 1950 and delivered to the Borger Fire Department in 1951. Manufactured by the Federal Motor Company, this truck began service in 1951 and fought its last fire at the Foxworth Galbraith Lumber Company in Borger in 1980. It is equipped with a 500 gallon tank and a 750 GPM pump. Included with the truck are hoses, ladders and miscellaneous fire fighting equipment.

The truck was stored at the Borger Fire Department from 1980 to 2000 and was fully functional when it was removed from service. The truck was stored in a shelter at the museum until 2014 when it was moved to a Hutchinson County equipment barn for storage when it was decided that the shelter it had been stored in was to be demolished to make room for a new exhibit. The truck has been continually stored indoors and is in good, restorable condition with good tires. It is offered as is, with no warranty or guaranty, express or implied. It is not operable and the buyer will be responsible for picking it up and transportation and delivery to its next location.

The truck was donated to the museum in September 2000. At the time of its retirement, the engine ran but the brakes were not acceptable for use on the street. Equipped as is, the truck is 9 feet tall, 23 feet 4 inches long and 7 feet 6 inches wide.
